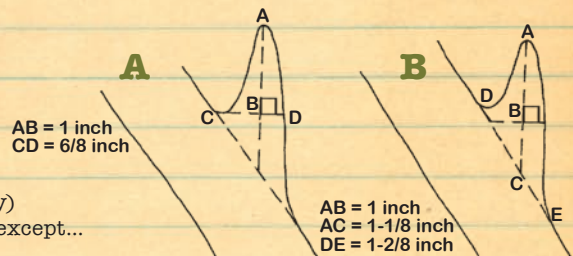
Question 4: Measuring Techniques

Question 6: Moose

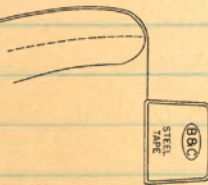
The most visually pleasing and thus highest scoring (usually) moose demonstrates all the following characteristics except...
