There is some unexplained reason for keen-scented animals to panic when the wind does not shift, no noise is made, and the hunter remains invisible. This situation has always been an interesting puzzle for speculation. It has happened to me with sheep, wolves, and elephants, when no bird or animal could possibly have warned my intended quarry.

The Ram River country produced two other interesting occurrences on this trip. While I was traveling ahead of the pack string, I encountered a camp along the river. I asked the name of the hunter, and I was informed that he was Carl Rungius, who was on his annual trip in the Rockies. This superb artist sat at his easel a short distance from his tent, sketching a natural background for a moose painting. A most pleasant visit ensued, for we both were great admirers of bighorn sheep and had hunted the same areas frequently. I was loath to end my encounter with this fine gentleman, who's American wild animal paintings are the finest ever produced.

In view from our camp near the head of the Ram River was the haunt of a huge billy goat. Every day he lay in the same bed on a steep shale mountain side. One morning, while Ray was scouting a distant sheep basin, I decided to collect this specimen for a museum. Imagine my chagrin when I glassed his bed-ground to see his remains being carried away by a big sow grizzly and her well-grown cub of several seasons. Here, however, was an opportunity to collect two trophies at one time: a beautifully furred bear, and the skull and horns of the old billy that had been stolen under my nose.

The two culprits dragged their prey into a steep-sided gully that ran down the mountain. I assumed that they would feed, then bury the remains, and bed down to watch it. Since the wind always blew down the mountain till noon and then shifted upward, I made a detour a mile or so to the left of the ravine; struggled up the mountain until I was well above and to one side of the ditch and sat down to wait the arrival of the up draft. One just does not stalk a grizzly from below if he values his own hide.

Sure enough, the wind changed shortly after noon. When it had become steady for about an hour, I circled the side hill easily and started down one rim of the rocky gully, with a shell in the barrel and the safety half off. I am no hero, and I'll admit that I had qualms about tackling an old sow and a three-quarter-grown cub on their kill.

Everything was progressing properly. The footing was quiet, the coulee could be observed from side to side, and I was all set to jump a pair of bear at any moment. Suddenly all my effort went for naught. The wind whipped a hundred and eighty degrees and hit me in the back of the neck. I might as well have activated a brass band. The bear hunt was over, so I sat down to watch an open glade several hundred yards below me. Within a few minutes mama and her son appeared, galloping away from my scent. Well, the stalk had been fun anyway, and my strategy would have worked if it had not been for that one stray puff of wind.

Some sheep hunters say that sheep pay little attention to wind and are not much alarmed by the smell of man. I disagree, for my experiences prove just the opposite where they have been heavily hunted. During this same trip, Ray and I spotted and approached an old lone ram with splendid heavy horns that would measure at least thirty-eight or thirty-nine inches. Since I had no desire to take him, we

decided to experiment by keeping out of sight, yet giving him our scent. When the animal got a good whiff of man scent, he almost had heart failure getting away from there. He would dash up a steep mountain side until he was completely out of wind, then stop with heaving sides until he had recovered enough breath to run some more. He continued this panicky pace until he disappeared over the very peak of the mountain, although he had never seen us at all. On another occasion a vagrant puff of wind cost me a forty-two or forty-three inch record book bighorn, just as I was crawling close to shooting distance.

Fate finally smiled on us toward the end of the trip. As we were pitching camp in a high pocket in the mountains, I took my binoculars and spotting scope to an open knoll where I could scan a lot of good ram country. In short order I saw a band of five feeding rams. Four had just average heads, but one huge-bodied ram had an outstanding set of horns. Even through the spotting scope at a distance of a couple miles, his horns looked long and heavy and appeared to exceed forty-three inches. He was not the forty-five I had always wanted, but he was just too good to pass up.

At crack of dawn we were on the way to the basin where he had been feeding when spotted. There he was with his four companions. As we waited for him to bed down, the wind became shifty, and the only sensible choice was to leave him undisturbed. Early next morning we approached his hideout again. A fog set in shortly after our arrival at the basin, and we had to retire a second time.

We made a third attempt the following day. Everything seemed favorable, when suddenly the band looked down past our camp, turned, and climbed over the peak as if the devil himself were after them. Disappointed, we glassed the country where our tents were hidden in the timber. In a distant mountain meadow was our pack string, which somehow had wandered in to view. Among them was one white horse. We assumed that its light color had frightened the rams. I resolved then and there that my future pack trains should consist of only dark bays, which somewhat resemble the color of moose.

We spent three more days looking for our departed sheep, but they had not returned. Very early on the fourth morning, when we were about to give up and break camp, we looked over the country once more. There was our quarry. He had just rounded a distant peak and was feeding near its summit.

The only way to get at him was to circle the mountain at its base, climb the opposite side, and come down from the top. We began our trip at once. It meant a steady climb and descent until late afternoon, when we arrived within shooting distance. Ray made a beautiful stalk. My legs were pretty rubbery after more than ten hours of steady hiking and climbing, but my shot, from about two hundred yards, ended our search of over two months. The head was not a large as I had first estimated, for he was only a ten-year-old ram, but his horns measured well over forty-two inches. I was completely done in when we stumbled into camp after midnight.

When the 1952 Records Book was published, the head scored more than 189 points and ranked twenty-third. Although I had previously killed a couple of large bighorn trophies, none of them gave me the effort or the satisfaction that this one had. To my way of thinking, one could consider this a real trophy head, for we passed up more than a hundred and twenty mature rams and had hunted almost ten weeks before securing it.
