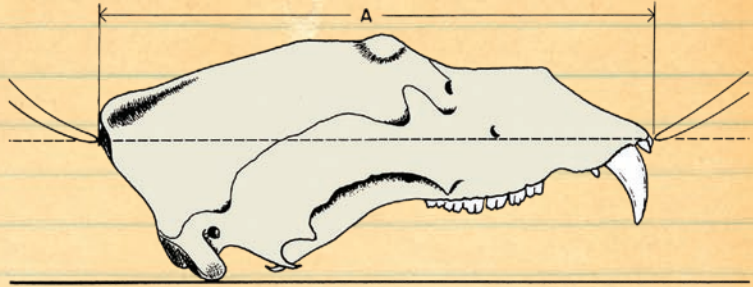

Question 1: Records Keeping - A Brief History

Question 2: Bears and Cats

All bear and cat skulls are measured to the nearest 1/16th of an inch. The records department commonly receives skull entries incorrectly measured or recorded to the 1/8th of an inch. What must be done to rectify this error so the trophy can be considered for acceptance into the records program.

- a) The skull must be rescored in 16ths.
- b) A conversion will be made by the records department converting 8ths to 16ths.
- c) The measurer must convert the 8ths to 16ths and resubmit.

Question 3: Moose

While abnormal points are not common on moose racks, they arise from:

- a) palm face on the front or back surface.
- b) inside edge of palm.
- c) beam below the palm.
- d) normal points.
- e) all of the above.

Question 4: Musk Ox

As with all other horned game, four quarter measurements are taken on each musk ox horn. However, musk ox are unique in that:

- a) the first quarter measurement (D-1) is a width measurement and the remaining three (D-2, D-3, & D-4) are circumference measurements.
- b) the first two quarter measurements (D-1 & D-2) are width measurements and the remaining two (D-3 & D-4) are circumference measurements.
- c) the first three quarter measurements (D-1, D-2, & D-3) are width measurements and the remaining one (D-4) is a circumference measurement.
- d) all quarter measurements are width measurements.

Question 5: General Procedures

Trophies equaling or exceeding the Awards Program minimums (e.g. typical whitetail = 160) but not exceeding the All-time minimums (e.g. typical whitetail deer = 170) are eligible for all of the following, except:

- a) receipt of a handsome B&C acceptance certificate.
- b) listing in "Recently Accepted Big Game Trophies" in *Fair Chase* magazine.
- c) listing in the next edition of the All-time records book, *Records of North American Big Game*.
- d) listing in the next edition of the Awards book (e.g. *Boone and Crockett Club's 27th Big Game Awards*).
- e) eligible for optional recognition items, such as trophy rings, belt buckles, and plaques.
- f) listing in species specific books such as, *Records of North American Whitetail Deer*.

Question 6: General Policies

If a trophy owner is not satisfied with the score arrived at by their B&C Official Measurer, they should:
