

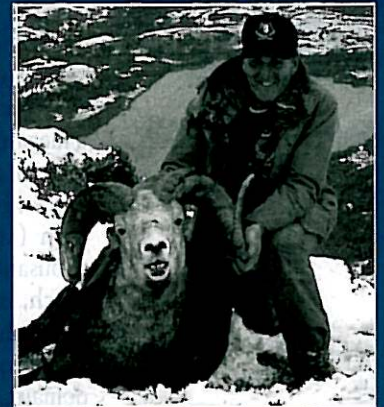

I hunted Stone's sheep with Gundahoo River Outfitters of Muncho Lake, British Columbia, during the 1995 season. My partner and I started our hunt on August 20, and I missed an opportunity at a nice ram the first day of the hunt. The remaining hunt found us looking for and finding rams, but just not able to put it all together, so I left unsuccessful.

My partner, Ken Jeziorski of Rapid City, South Dakota, and guide, Alfred, connected with a nice 38-inch, 9-1/2 year old ram on day six of the hunt.

Arthur and Crystal Thompson, owners of the Gundahoo River Outfitters, found an opening later in the season and invited me back to try again. The October weather was very hit and miss for flying or hunting; however, we were able to get a great ram after a long hard stalk on October 6. It was 9-1/2 years old and scored 165-1/8 points. Gundahoo River has a good sheep population, having seen rams almost every day.

I had several guides during my hunts and all were good, knowledgeable guides for Stone's sheep. Thanks to Bronc, Don and Darcy for the hard work and quality hunt! And Arthur and Crystal are first class people who run a good honest operation.
