## Stone's Sheep Awards Minimum Lowered

Effective immediately, the Records Committee has lowered the Awards Program minimum score for Stone's sheep from 165 points to 160, which is now the same as the minimum for Dall's sheep. The new minimum is

retroactive and applies to all Stone's sheep regardless of when they were taken. The All-time minimum remains at 170 points.

### Last Notice for Records Book Changes

The 13th edition of the All-time records book, *Records of North American Big Game*, will be released fall 2011. ### Asterisked Trophy Alert

All Official Measurers should note that the owners of all trophies asterisked in the 26th and 27th Awards books have been notified in writing that they need to have their trophies re-scored so they can take their rightful place in the 13th edition of the All-time records book that will be released next fall.

Thus, you may be contacted in the next couple of weeks to re-score these trophies.

If contacted, simply score the trophy and mail your original score chart to my attention at B&C's office by January 31st with a note written across the top of it that states, "Re-measurement to Remove Asterisk." We will then compare the re-measurements to the original score chart and determine the correct final score for each trophy. If the asterisk is not removed through this process, the trophy will be listed with an asterisk in the 13th edition and then dropped from all future records books in keeping with long-standing B&C policy.

Trophy owners with asterisked trophies in previous records books who have not been recently contacted about the asterisk removal procedure should immediately call the records office at (406) 542-1888, ext. 205, for more details. It is possible that we don't have your current mailing address.

### Official Measurers Who Recently Passed Away

B&C has lost two dedicated Official Measurers during the last few months who I would like to acknowledge. Their contributions to B&C's records-keeping activities are greatly appreciated.

Glenn L. Bowers of Dillsburg, Pennsylvania, passed away on June 25th. He and his son Toby were appointed Official Measurers in 1988 after successfully completing a measurer training workshop held in Harrisburg that year. They worked together as a team scoring countless trophies at their homes in Dillsburg.

Glenn spent his career working for the Pennsylvania Game Commission (PGC) where he started as a wildlife biologist in 1948 researching cottontail rabbits and developing management plans for beagle hunting clubs. He retired from the PGC in 1982 after 17 years as its executive director.

Glenn piloted the F4U Corsair during WW II on nearly 90 combat missions in the South Pacific. Twenty-eight of those missions were with the famous Black Sheep Squadron before it was pulled from combat duty in January 1944 after losing its leader, "Pappy" Boyington, in combat. Glenn was awarded 11 air medals and three Distinguished Flying Crosses for his service.

Glenn A. St. Charles, the founder of the Pope and Young Club, passed away on September 19th. He was a member of the National Field Archery Association in the mid-1950s when he sought and received permission from B&C to use its copyrighted scoring system to record trophies taken only with archery equipment. That permission was transferred to Pope and Young Club when Glenn founded that organization in 1961. Glenn was elected to the Archery Hall of Fame in 1991.

Glenn was deeply involved in B&C. He was appointed an Official Measurer in 1958, and voted one of B&C's 100 regular members in 1980. As a member of the Club he served on the records committee and five Awards Program Judges Panels. Glenn was

## BOOK REVIEW

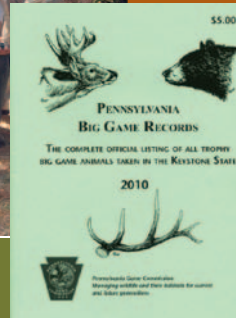
### PENNSYLVANIA BIG GAME RECORDS

Pennsylvania's Big Game Scoring Program Coordinator Bob D'Angelo recently announced the Pennsylvania Game Commission has published the 2010 edition of *Pennsylvania Big Game Records*. This 64-page booklet contains a few photographs and trophy listings of the Keystone State's black bear, whitetail deer (typical and non-typical), and American elk (typical and non-typical) records. The listings include the score, county where taken, hunter, year taken, and state rank. There are separate listings in each category for trophies taken with a firearm or bow. Copies of *Pennsylvania Big Game Records* cost \$5 each, plus \$1.25 for shipping and handling. They can be

### 19 New Official Measurers Appointed

In spite of the time-consuming 27th Awards Program held earlier this year in Reno and editing of the 27th Awards book, the records department was able to squeeze in one Official Measurer training workshop during 2010 for the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks. Upon successful completion of the workshop held September 20-24 at Holmes County State Park near Durant, 19 new scorers were appointed. Sixteen attendees were from Mississippi and one each attended from Alabama, Maryland, and Texas. No more workshops will be held until next spring or summer.

### Taxidermy Stands

They say that necessity is the mother of invention, which is why Kentucky Official Measurer Kelly Stockdale has developed a portable, lightweight, yet sturdy, taxidermy stand to assist with scoring shoulder-mounted trophies such as deer, sheep, goats, and pronghorn. A separate attachment is available for holding trophies on skull plates.

Kelly's stands cost \$170, plus \$40 for shipping and handling. The attachment for holding skull plates with antlers or horns is \$35 and the scoring clipboard is \$25.
