THEODORE ROOSEVELT OUTDOORSMAN, by R. L. WILSON, PUBLISHED BY TROPHY ROOM BOOKS, AGOURA, CA, NUMBERED COPIES OF LIMITED EDITION OF 1,000 COPIES SIGNED BY THE AUTHOR, HAS OVER 350 PAGES, QUARTO, A DUST JACKET, AND MORE THAN 175 ILLUSTRATIONS.

Originally published in 1971 with a forward by Archibald Roosevelt, this new edition has been vastly revised and expanded. It has a new introduction by T.R.'s great grandson, Tweed Roosevelt. It includes a firsthand memoir on Colonel Roosevelt's first elephant hunt (from recently discovered Heller archives), the fascinating "The Omen of Death on the Moyowosi" by noted antique arms dealer/collector Greg Martin on a safari that was armed with several of T.R.'s most famous rifles including the Holland & Holland .450 double rifles used on his historic 1909 African expedition.

The book is unique in tracing Theodore Roosevelt's life from the perspective of his never ending love of the outdoors. A rare combination of sportsman and naturalist, his love of hunting was only exceeded by his concern for conservation of America's natural resources. His efforts to create national parks and preserve forests and wildlife represented a pioneer effort for combating the ills of free-wheeling industrialism.

The author, Larry Wilson, is an authority on firearms and has published many books particularly on the historical aspects of Winchester and Colt. Theodore Roosevelt was a great supporter of Winchester

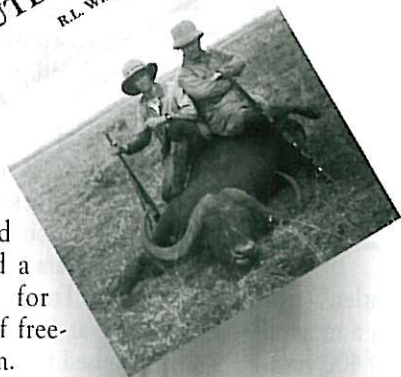
rifles. He was determined that American made firearms should play a dominant role on his African expedition. This new book includes a fascinating 30 page appendix section titled, "Theodore Roosevelt and the Winchester Arms Co." It details the incredible exchange of letters between Roosevelt and Winchester in preparation for the trip and his unbelievable demands for perfection. Only a president could demand and get so much attention!

From the mountains and plains of North America, to Africa and the jungles of South America, we see a rare combination of a man who was as serious about hunting as he was about conservation of the world's natural endowments. This book which portrays T.R.'s life and philosophy should be of particular interest to *Fair Chase* readers.
