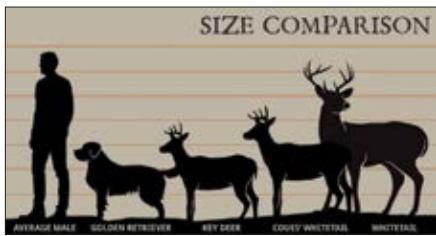
Paving a Way for the Wilderness Act

New World’s Record Rocky Mountain Goat

Deep in the wilds of British Columbia, a die-hard hunter connects with the billy of a lifetime. A Special Judges Panel convened by the Boone and Crockett Club confirmed a new World’s Record Rocky Mountain goat. The Club announced the new record at the Wild Sheep Foundation’s 2023 Sheep Show in Reno, Nevada. Justin Kallusky’s British Columbia billy officially scores 60-4/8 points, eclipsing the previous World’s Record by three points. Each horn measures well over 12 inches.



Whaleback Fire Forest Restoration Project

In 2021, the Club worked with members of Congress to include more than \$8 billion in funding for forest resiliency projects in the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act. 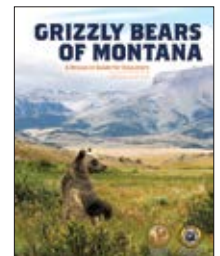

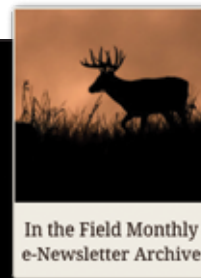

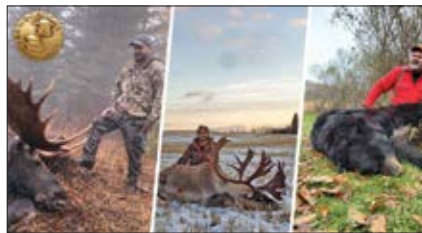


MORE TO THE SCORE
