

# TRAIL CAMERA VIRTUAL CURRICULUM

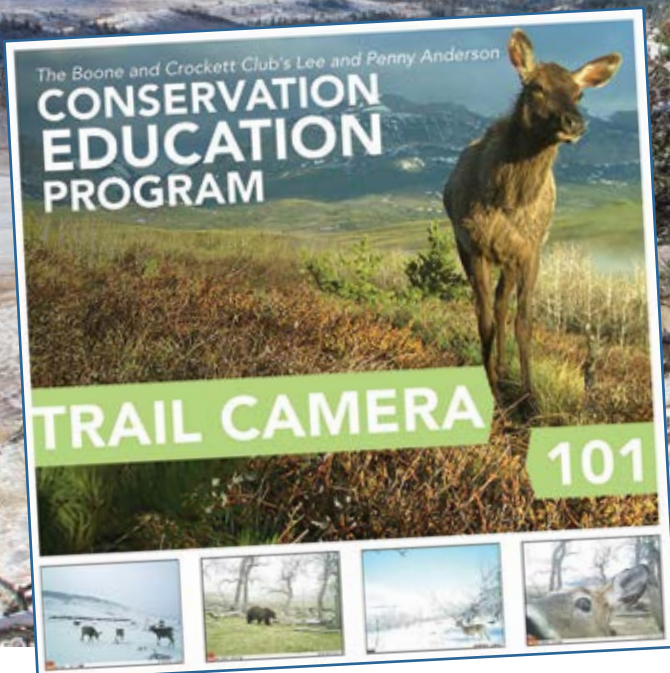
BOONE AND CROCKETT CLUB RELEASES ONLINE CURRICULUM TO SUPPORT WILDLIFE SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION FOR 5TH TO 8TH GRADERS

The Boone and Crockett Club's Lee and Penny Anderson Conservation Education Program has released its first "virtual" wildlife education lesson plans that teach middle schoolers about wildlife science. The Trail

Camera curriculum uses trail camera footage from the Club's Theodore Roosevelt Memorial Ranch near Dupuyer, Montana, to teach practical, real-life biological principles with no travel or field trip-related expenses

required. The Trail Camera 101 and three training modules provide educators with a ready-made lesson plan that includes trail camera photo sequences, short answer questionnaires, vocabulary lessons with "word

finds," teacher keys, lesson extensions and background information. The curriculum was developed by the Club's Director of Conservation programs, Luke Coccoli, as part of his Master's in education project.
