



BOONE AND CROCKETT CLUB HEADQUARTERS, THE OLD MILWAUKEE DEPOT, TO GET A FACELIFT

\$500,000 MONTANA HISTORIC PRESERVATION GRANT SUPPORTS EXTERIOR RENOVATIONS

In May 2021, the Club received a \$500,000 grant through the Montana Historic Preservation program for renovations to our Missoula Headquarters building—the Old Milwaukee Depot.

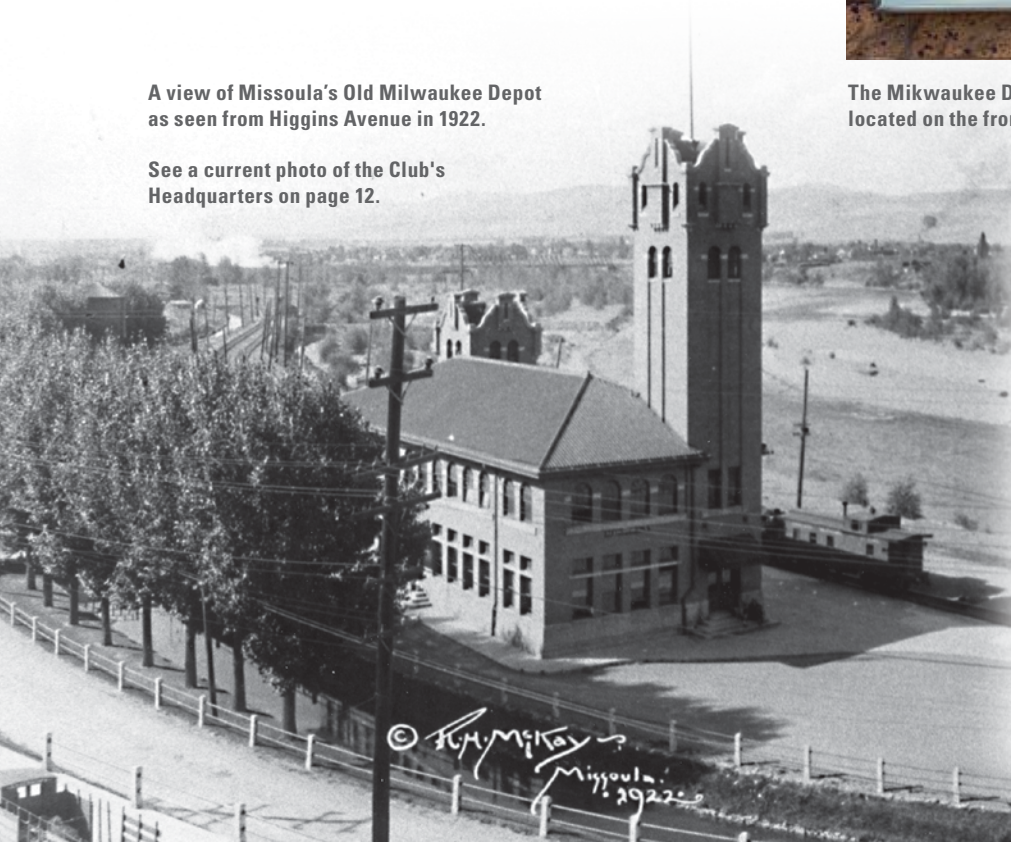
The historic preservation grant provides the starting funds to restore the building’s exterior, most notably replacing the entire roof with Spanish clay tiles to replicate the original structure. The Milwaukee Depot was built in 1910 by the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul, and Pacific Railroad and is individually listed on the State and National Register of Historic Places. The building’s Mission Style detailing is one of the finest examples of early 1900 railroad station architecture in Montana. An architectural firm with significant experience in historic preservation projects has been engaged for the project. The full cost of the exterior renovations, which will include replacing the current asphalt roof with Spanish tiles, repairing soffits and gutters, masonry work, and more, is expected to cost about \$1.4 million. The Club is actively seeking additional grant opportunities as well as donors who are interested in supporting the project. Renovations are slated to begin in spring 2022. ■
